

Accessibility:

How to Increase Display Size

Android

1. Open the Settings app and tap the "Accessibility" tab.
2. Tap "Font Size." Depending on your device, this option may be hidden in a "Vision" menu.
3. You will be presented with a slider that lets you control the font size. Drag the slider as far to the right as you want — the farther right it goes, the larger your text will grow.
4. Tap "Done" to save your changes.
5. Tap "Display Size."
6. You will be shown another slider. Slide it to the right to zoom in more and make icons and text larger.

iPhone

1. Open the Settings app.
2. Tap Accessibility.
3. Tap Display & Text Size.
4. Tap Larger Text.
5. A slider with even bigger text options will appear. Drag it to the right until you reach your desired text size.

Mac

1. Go to the Apple menu and choose "System Preferences".
2. Go to the "Display" preference panel, then to the "Display" tab.
3. Next to the "Resolution" section, choose "Scaled".
4. Select "Larger Text" from the options available, you will see a pop-up message saying "Are you sure you want to switch to this scaled resolution? When using this scaled resolution, some applications may not fit entirely on screen." so choose "OK" to confirm that you wish to use the larger text size scaled resolution
5. When satisfied with the size of the onscreen element size, font size, and text size, close out of System Preferences and use the Mac as usual.

Windows 10

1. Click on the Windows icon in the lower left corner of your screen.
2. Click on Settings in the list on the left. It looks like a gear.
3. Click on Ease of Access.
4. Make everything bigger by changing 100% to 125%.

Accessibility:

How to Increase Screen Contrast

Android

1. Open the Settings app and tap the "Accessibility" tab.
2. Check the box next to High Contrast Text to turn it on.

iPhone

1. Open the Settings app.
2. Tap Accessibility.
3. Under the 'Vision' section, tap 'Increase Contrast'.
4. Tap the on/off toggle switch next to 'Increase Contrast'.

Mac

1. Go to the Apple menu and choose "System Preferences".
2. Next, click on the "Accessibility" button.
3. From the left sidebar, select the "Display" option.
4. Here, click on the checkmark next to "Increase Contrast."

Windows 10

1. Select the Start button
2. Select Settings > Ease of Access > High contrast.
3. To turn on high contrast mode, select the toggle button under Turn on high contrast. Windows may display a "Please wait" screen for a few seconds after which the colors on the screen change.
